Portfolio, composed by: Synthesis using texts related with the contents covered in theoretical and practical lessons, personal reflection and bibliographic search. Description of activities proposals , which are considered of significant use in psychomotor sessions (including the use of music, creative writing, dance, drama, dance, visual arts, play) (10 activities) Group work: on one of these topics: Body, corporeal and non-verbal communication; Art, culture and expressions; Fundamentals of expressive therapies; The anthropological domain in expressive therapies: healing rituals; Creativity, spontaneity and improvisation; Arts, aesthetics and education by the arts. The emphasis of the theme development should be placed in the conjunction with the content of psychomotor rehabilitation.
